HPV VACCINATION PROGRAMME

The HPV vaccine is offered free to all boys and girls who are aged 12 to 13 years (school Year 8)

The HPV vaccine is highly effective at reducing the risk of

getting HPV.

Since the vaccine has been used, there has been a big drop in the number of young people getting conditions linked to HPV, including some cancers such as cervical cancer, head and neck cancer, and genital warts.

Research suggests that over time the HPV vaccine will help save thousands of lives in the UK, and **your school can help**.



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WHAT IS HPV?



is the short name for more than 100 viruses called **Human Papillomavirus**. It is very common, and 7 in 10 people will get infected at some point in their lives.

HPV usually has **no symptoms**, which is why it's so easy to pass on. In most people it clears up quickly, but if it doesn't, it can cause certain types of cancer.

WHY IS THE WHY IS THE

The HPV vaccine is offered to boys and girls in school in Year 8 to protect against some cancers and infections.

Since the HPV vaccine was widely introduced in 2008, it has reduced **cervical cancer rates** by almost 90% in women in their 20s.









HOW SCHOOLS CAN HELP

Delivering immunisation programmes through schools is **vital** to ensuring that most children and young people have easy access to vaccines. This helps to achieve high uptake of vaccination and reduced inequalities in health for children and young people.

Our research shows that young people trust the information they get through school and so your help will have a **significant impact**.

KEY TALKING POINTS

- The HPV vaccine is offered free to all boys and girls who are aged 12 to 13 years (school Year 8).
- You will receive a consent form in the school term ahead of the NHS vaccination team visiting your child's school. This may be digital or hard copy. You will need to give consent via the form for your child to receive the vaccine in school.
- The HPV vaccine is a safe and effective way to protect against some cancers and infections.
- The HPV vaccine is given in the top part of the arm.
- The HPV vaccine is excellent at giving protection against HPV and is very safe. It is expected that the vaccine will eventually save thousands of lives each year.
- Young people who miss their HPV vaccination in school will be given other opportunities to receive the vaccine before they leave statutory schooling at the end of year 11.
